Collection overview

An extensive research-level collection of material on Latin America and the Caribbean combining the collections of the Institute for the Study of the Americas and Senate House Library.

Collection strengths include:

- * Anthropology
- * Economics
- * History
- * Literature
- * Politics
- * Sociology

Collection location

* Most books are located on the 3rd Floor, North Block, adjacent to the United States Studies collection and within easy reach of the Institute of Commonwealth Studies collection in the Small Hall on the ground floor of the North Block

* All items available on open access will display the location LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES, with the classmark prefix 34 eg LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES North Block 3rd Floor (34) E18.83 .D86 2000

* Large books are shelved in a separate sequence – indicated by the classmark prefix ‘f’ or ‘folio’ in front of the location code eg LATIN AMERICAN FOLIO North Block 3rd Floor (f34) KG96 .J83 1995

* Most periodicals are located on the periodicals open shelves (PS) on the 3rd floor of the South Block – access is via the Institute of Classical Studies through the gate to the right of the Institute’s reception desk

* Recent issues of periodicals are on display bays in the Goldsmiths; Room on the 4th floor of the South Block

* Some items display the location STACK SERVICE. These are held in the closed access stacks and will be fetched for you on request (please ask at the Issue Desk on 4th Floor South Block or see our website for further details

* To locate individual titles use the online catalogue

****Note: please be aware that the loan period for borrowable material from the Latin American collection may be 4 weeks, 2 weeks or 1 week: please check the due date on your loans!***

- * It consists of monographs and folders containing key readings for ISA courses
- *Teaching Collection monographs may be borrowed overnight (from 4pm to 10am the next day, and over the weekend) **by ISA students and staff only**
- * Material in the course folders is for the use of **ISA students and staff only**

* ISA's film collection consists of a wide range of feature films and documentaries

* It may be used by all Library users but within the Library only: ***material may not be borrowed***

* Documentaries are held at the Main Counter on Floor 2 of the North Block and must be requested there

* Feature films and documentaries may be in DVD or video format

* DVDs may be viewed at workstations with headphones in both South and North Blocks, or you can view them on your laptops (headphones can be provided): please ask staff for further information

* Videos may be viewed on specially adapted workstations in the Middlesex South Reading Room on the 4th Floor of the South Block, or on the workstation located on Floor 3 of the North Block, within the Latin American collection area: please ask staff for further information
