- Recent issues of periodicals are on display bays in the Goldsmiths' Room – **4th floor, South Block**
- Psychological tests and manuals with the classmark (67) Office Tests are available from the Issue Desk, **2nd Floor, North Block**
- Some items are held in the closed access stacks. These will display the location **Stack Service**. Please ask at the Issue Desk, 4th floor, South Block or see our website for further details
